#### 1. Stop Harming the U.S. Patent System

- · Change the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office's terminal disclaimer practices to fundamentally alter the role of patents in commercializing new technologies. See USII comments here.
- · Weaken the ability of the International Trade Commission to protect U.S. IP. See USI comments here.

- · Limit the enforceability of standard-essential patents. See USI comments here.

#### 2. Start Healing the U.S. Patent System

USIJ has played a critical role in building support for bipartisan reforms that would strengthen America's innovation ecosystem. This includes:

- · Reforming the Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB) to respect patent holders and prohibit abuse like serial attacks on disruptive startups. See USI support for the PREVAIL Act.
- · Clarifying U.S. patent eligibility law. See USIJ Senate <u>testimony</u> and <u>comments</u> in support of the Patent Eligibility Restoration Act (PERA).
- Restoring the presumption of injunctive relief when a court finds patent infringement. See <u>USIJ support</u> for the RESTORE Act.
- · Correcting the falsehood that patents cause higher prices. See USIJ comments here.
